Sir Andrew McFarlane was appointed to the High Court, Family Division in 2005 and was for 5 years the Family Division Liaison Judge for the Midland Circuit. He was the legal member of the Government 'Family Justice Review' Panel. He was appointed as a Lord Justice of Appeal in July 2011 and now sits full time in the Court of Appeal in London.



Sir Robin Knowles sits in the Commercial Court, the Administrative Court, and the Court of Appeal Criminal Division. He is also a member of the Disclosure Working Group, which in July published the Practice Direction and Disclosure Review Document.



Oliver Glynn-Jones is a solicitor advocate and global head of Bryan Cave Leighton Paisner's Commercial Disputes group. He has over 18 years' experience of resolving complex, major corporate disputes. He advises across all aspects of commercial litigation and led the team that achieved the first contested order to use predictive coding in the case of Brown v BCA.



Fiona Paterson has appeared in several landmark cases before both the Supreme Court and the Court of Appeal. She has also acted for Great Ormond Street in a number of high profile medical treatment cases including the Charlie Gard and Olivia Stanca cases.



Kathryn Clague is an experienced litigator with a background in civil litigation and regulatory law, including personal injury, professional negligence, contractual disputes, nuisance and consumer protection. She has been a lecturer on the Bar Professional Training Course at Cardiff University since September 2015.



Melanie Willems is head of international arbitration at Haynes and Boone and is experienced in all forms of alternative dispute resolution (expert determination, mediation, adjudication and so forth). She also represents clients in court in the UK, and sits as an arbitrator.



Sir David Foskett was appointed to the High Court Queen's Bench Division in 2007. He is the Judge in charge of the Queen's Bench Civil List. Sir David is also Master Treasurer of Gray's inn, one of the four Inns of Court which have the exclusive right to call men and women to the Bar of England and Wales.



David Quest QC is a skilled advocate and a formidable cross-examiner, with extensive trial experience both in court (in the UK and offshore) and arbitration. He is recommended in the legal directories as a leading silk in banking and finance, commercial dispute resolution, civil fraud, and offshore work.



Chris Ward has been a Police Officer for nearly 30 years. He has spent most of his service as a Detective and most recently was the Head of Thames Valley Police Major Crime Unit. He has extensive experience within homicide investigation, as well as kidnap and extortion investigations.
